

St Maximilian Kolbe, Priest, Martyr

Saint Maximilian was born in Poland in 1894. as a Franciscan, he worked to spread the gospel in his native Poland as well as in Japan. He had a great devotion to our lady.

During the Nazi occupation of Poland, he helped thousands of refugees, including polish jews. He was arrested by the gestapo in 1941 and imprisoned at Auschwitz, three months Maximilian's arrival, a prisoner escaped. In retaliation, 10 men were chosen at random to die. One was a young father; Maximilian offered to take his place. His offer accepted, Maximilian died on this day in 1941 and was canonized in 1982.



The Assumption of the virgin Mary celebrates he being assumed taken up Body and Soul into heaven at the end of her earthly life. It began as a Feast Day in the Eastern Church after the Council of Ephesus (431) proclaimed Mary the Mother of God. By the 16th century, the feast celebrated Mary's dormition, her 'falling asleep' meaning her death; there are several ancient icons of the dormition. The Western church began to celebrate this Feast circa 650
